Last year the Friends were able to raise over a \$1,000 at this unique fundraiser to support future programs at the Chellberg Farm. The Friends will also be supplying the Maple Cream cookies and pure Maple Syrup for the tasting enjoyment of visitors to Maple Sugar Time.

The Friends will be holding our Annual Meeting at the Indiana Dunes State Park Nature Center on Monday, April 24 at 6:30pm. Friends Annual Native Plant Sale on Saturday, June 3

The 27th Annual Native Plant Sale will be held at the Friends' House/Office located on the northwest corner of Mineral Springs and Oak Hill roads (1000 W. Oak Hill Road) in Porter, IN. This will also be the location for pickup of Pre-sale plant orders. Please park in the adjacent parking lot or in the Indiana Dunes National Park's Headquarters' Complex which is directly to the north off Mineral Springs Road. Just a short walk to the Native Plant Sale tents.

You can pick up a printed copy at the front desk of the National Park's Visitor Center and the State Park's Nature Center. To request a copy be mailed to you, email your contact information to **nativeplants@dunefriends.org**.

Pre-sale ordering of native plants is strongly encouraged as every year, on the day of the sale, some native plant varieties will be unavailable due to their popularity during the order period. Pre-sale orders must be received by May 20. New this year at the sale, we will be offering starter kits for Mesic Woodland, Tall Prairie and Short Prairie habitats. Each kit will contain 3 multiples of 5 different, successful and popular habitat specific plant species.

Volunteer help is always needed for the set-up of the plants and filling the pre-sale plant orders on Friday, June 2 from 9:00am - 4:00pm. On June 3, the day of the sale, help will be needed from 7:30am until 1:30pm. Maple Sugar Time Festival: Saturday, March 11 and Sunday, March 12 from 10:00am - 4:00pm

Enjoy a sweet taste of spring during the 46th annual Maple Sugar Time festival. Take a self-guided tour of the sugaring operation at historic Chellberg Farm which will be bustling with maple sugaring activities.

Learn how Native Americans first boiled maple sap into sugar and how early settlers used large iron kettles to make syrup. While walking along the maple trail you will pass by the sugar shack where sap is still boiled down the way the Chellberg family did it back in the 1930s. You can even learn how to make maple syrup at home and how modern maple sugar farmers use advanced technology to make syrup today. Kids can learn how to tap a tree at the Maple Fun Zone and can meet some of the farm animals. Before you head home, stop by the front of the farmhouse where Indiana-produced maple syrup and related products will be for sale. Saturday March 11 and Sunday March 12 will be Fee Free throughout the Indiana Dunes National Park for the Maple Sugar Time Festival.

Stop by the historic Chellberg Farm to tour the farmhouse and visit the animals. Rangers and volunteers will be on hand to share the area's history.
