### Friends of Indiana Dunes Updates

Spring is always a busy time for the Friends with Maple Sugar Time, Native Plant Sale and Birding Festival occurring in March, April and May. This year Maple Sugar Time was cancelled due to the continuing concerns associated with the Covid Pandemic. Our 25<sup>th</sup> Annual Native Plant Sale was again Order Only with curbside delivery. It appears the sale will be slightly more profitable than last year. Birding Festival brought many visitors to both the National and State Parks. The Friends hosted a booth providing information about our upcoming events and our partners.

The Friends have also been busy this Spring working on our House/Office with Board Member Rudy Moyado organizing replacing shingles and installing new gutters with leaf guards. Board Member Tracey Stevens has spearheaded the landscaping – yuccas removed, native pollinator attracting plants have been added to front of the house, two Redbuds in the yard, and grass planted where the hedge was removed. Tracey also painted a beautiful rain barrel complete with native plants and pollinators – bees, butterflies and hummingbirds.

For Summer, the Friends have three State Park Beach Cleanup Days planned for Sundays at 8:00am on June 27, July 25 and August 29. We are partnering with Board Member Paul Stofko's Crazy Legs Running Series for these needed service days. Join us – all needed supplies and drinking water provided. Welcome to the Indiana Dunes National Park and Indiana Dunes State Park... As the managers for each park, we are working to provide information to you, the visitor, for both the Indiana Dunes National Park and the Indiana Dunes State Park. What's the difference? Both are great public parks. The partnership here is not unique; there are many places where national and state parks overlap. The combination just means more and better opportunities for visitors.

Indiana Dunes National Park is one of 423 units of the National Park System that includes places like Yellowstone, Grand Canyon and Yosemite, a collection of America's greatest natural and cultural places and stories and is operated by the National Park Service...



Within the boundary of Indiana Dunes National Park is Indiana Dunes State Park, one of 25 State Parks managed by the State of Indiana Department of Natural Resources, Division of State Parks, and part of state government. Indiana Dunes is one of the best examples of your state and federal governments working side by side to provide terrific public service and experiences...

We are working on ways to help visitors minimize the time they spend waiting to park to enjoy the beaches and trails. Our parking hotline (219-395-1003) is a good place to start as you begin your trip and get closer to the Indiana Dunes. Why get stuck in your car when you can find available parking and discover a new beach? With over 15-miles of beaches, there is always a place to find some peace and quiet here. You may have to be adventurous to find it. The best advice is get an early start, avoid the weekends if you can, and do some research on our website or app before you arrive.

### **National Park Programs**

After a 14-month pause due to the pandemic, we are happy to finally be able to offer ranger-led hikes and programs to the public at the national park. Programs restarted on May 8<sup>th</sup> with two Spring Wildflower Hikes at Heron Rookery. For at least the first month of programs, reservations are required, and each hike will be limited to 10 people with masks required when social distancing is not possible. In mid-June, a determination will be made regarding increasing the number of people on a program and perhaps the loosening of other restrictions if enough progress against the pandemic has occurred. We look forward to seeing you again!

Unfortunately, some things will not be happening due to the pandemic. The popular Midsummer Festival at Chellberg Farm is cancelled. The crowds and large numbers of participants singing while dancing around the Maypole was not something that can be safely mitigated. We are making tentative plans for special events in September when we believe the pandemic will be under much better control. Be watching in the next issue for details.

On a happier note, we will have two more beach areas open this summer compared to last year. Both Central Avenue and Portage Lakefront will be fully open thanks to sand nourishment at both sites and a repair of the rock revetment at Portage. This should help ease a little of the crowding at our other beaches, but we still recommend that visitors arrive early on busy summer weekends and use out new Beach Parking Line, 219-395-1003, to get the latest information.

Thank you to everyone in the Friends for all your support and help over this last year! We could not have gotten through these difficult times without you.

After being closed to the public for over a year, children are starting to return to the Dunes Learning Center (DLC) campus! A few small groups are coming for day programs, following their online experiences earlier in the year. Our Outreach educators are also slowly returning to classrooms, wrapping up Citizen Science study programs and more. All staff is hard at work preparing for Summer Camp. New interns and fellows will be arriving at the beginning of June, with camps beginning later in the month. We are thrilled to once again share the beautiful Indiana Dunes National Park with kids!

Since late last year, DLC has been offering monthly community education workshops via Zoom. The online offerings have proven popular with both local Friends as well as folks across the country and beyond - February's Indigenous Astronomy workshop attracted more than a dozen people from Canada!

This summer, we'll take a deeper look at some of the fascinating animals in our area. Interested in a topic but can't make the date? No problem. Tuesday, June 22, 6:30-8:00pm: Beautiful Butterflies & Mysterious Moths: The Lepidoptera Around Us Celebrate Pollinator Week with DLC! Join Steve Sass and Amanda Smith for a presentation about the amazing adaptions of butterflies and moths. They will highlight their popular Great American Indiana Nature Lepidoptera Project (GAINLP) and provide tips on butterfly and moth viewing and information about their importance in the ecosystem including as pollinators.

**Wednesday, July 21, 6:30-8:00pm: Where Are The Turtles? --** Learn about the incredible diversity of turtles, some extraordinary adaptations, and how researchers find them in the wild. This webinar will introduce native turtle species from the Midwest, many of which can be found while hiking around the Dunes. Callie Klatt Golba, a turtle researcher, will discuss strategies used to study the state-endangered Blanding's turtle and turtle conservation efforts.
