On May 11, the Friends and the Indiana DNR Division of State Parks and Preserves recognized all who made donations to the Indiana Dunes State Park ADA compliant Beach Mats project. Please take a visit to the State Park's beach and see these fantastic mats in use. Thanks again to all who generously donated to this effort.



In response to meetings with Superintendent Paul Labovitz, the Friends will develop a Hardship Fund to help underserved populations obtain Indiana Dunes National Park Annual passes. The details of this community outreach program will be made public in early June on our website (dunefriends.org). The Friends will be requesting donations from local citizens to help with this endeavor.

Meet at the Mount Baldy parking lot for a ranger-led hike to the top of the beautiful and famous Mount Baldy. The views of Lake Michigan and the surrounding area are spectacular. No reservation required.

Take an hour long self-guided hike into Indiana's only quaking bog. Rangers and volunteers stationed along the trail will help you understand this unique place filled with carnivorous plants and orchids.


#### Folk Music at the Farm with Save the Tunes – July 10 and 24, August 7 and 21 from 5:00pm to 6:00pm

#### 15th Annual Perseid Meteor Shower and Star Gazing Event - Saturday, August 13 at 8:30pm



#### An Introduction to Wild Edibles of the Dunes - Saturday, June 18 from 9:00am-12:00pm

Learn some of the local plants that have been used for thousands of years as food or medicine.
