Friends of Indiana Dunes Updates

It has been a busy Fall for the Friends of Indiana Dunes. Many of our Board Members have been helping out getting the house looking more like an office. Pictures have been hung with each room having a different theme – farm life, local birds, sandy beaches, aviation (Chanute gliders to NIKE base) and voyageurs. The Friends' Office is open the first Saturday of each month from 9:00 a.m.- Noon and every Wednesday from 1:00-4:00 p.m. Masks are required for entry in accordance with federal Covid mandates.

The Friends added four new Board members this Fall. Welcome to Sue Grossbauer, Zach Lindeman, Marti Pizzini, and Michelle Shebesh. All have great enthusiasm and skills which will enhance our Board of Directors. We are hoping to add a few more Directors in Spring 2022. The current Board will be retreating in January to develop short and long-term goals for the Friends of Indiana Dunes.

This year the Friends have been the recipient of many Memorial donations. Two large donations were for memorial benches at the State Park which will placed into service Spring 2022 along with the three benches the Friends purchased for the Bird Tower Platform. Thanks to all the members who sent donations to help cover the cost of the Friends' benches.

To further our support of the Dunes Learning Center (DLC), the Friends covered the cost to send eight DLC interns to the fall session of the Indiana Master Naturalist (IMN) program at the Indiana Dunes State Park. The interns will create short videos or written presentations on an environmental topic they particularly enjoyed or learned more about. These programs will be shared on the Friends website (<u>dunefriends.org</u>) and Facebook page. Special thanks to our Friends' members who serve as coordinators for IMN class.



Several Friends Board Members helped our new Vice-Chair Paul Stofko with his Crazy Legs Race Series' 5K Turkey Toss at Hawthorne Park in Porter on Sunday, November 28. A portion of the registration fees for the race were donated to the Friends. Friends House/Office Update



The Friends' Chair has been working with Serena Ard Curator/Historian at the Westchester Township History Museum on the ownership history of the Friend house/office. In 1905, Alfred Borg bought from Frances Howe the SE 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of Section 27 in Township 37 Range 6 West in Porter County (approximately 38 acres) for \$2000. Alfred Borg was married to Emily Chellberg, the daughter of Anders and Johanna, who owned the farm just to the south.

In 1919, Alfred and Emily Borg sold 9/10 of an acre of land to Elmer and Violet Johnson for \$100. This parcel was basically where the house and adjacent parking lot now used by the Friends is located. The price seemed exceptionally cheap, but Violet's maiden name was Borg, Alfred and

Emily's daughter. Elmer Johnson was a partner in the Flynn Funeral Home, which eventually became Flynn-Johnson. We know the Friends house is a typical 1920s clap board style probably built by Elmer Johnson. In the late 1940s, Steve and Olga Slamka purchased the property and then sold it in 1978 to the National Park Service. In late 2019, the Friends acquired a thirty-year lease from the Indiana Dunes National Park for the use of the house and adjacent garage as office and storage space.

Winter Wonderland Bilingual Program: Saturday, December 18, 2021 from 1:30-3:30 p.m. CST

Join a ranger for a short presentation and learn about what animals do during the winter (hibernation, migration, and adaptation). After the presentation, we will go on a short hike in Miller Woods trail and come back to the Douglas Center to do a winter art craft. Enjoy this family friendly exploration at Indiana Dunes National Park. The presentations, hike, and craft will take place in both Spanish and in English. The presentation in Spanish will take place from 1:30-1:45 p.m. followed by an English presentation from 1:45–2:00 p.m. After the presentations, follow the ranger outside for a hike in beautiful Miller Woods to search for signs of animals preparing for the winter. Afterwards, warm up inside the Douglas Center with a hot beverage supplied by the Friends of Indiana Dunes while the kids do a winter craft.



Winter Solstice Hike: Tuesday, December 21, 2021 from 3:00-5:00 p.m. CST

Join rangers for a sunset hike on the shortest day of the year at the Kemil Beach parking lot. Catch the sunset and enjoy sweeping views of the Great Marsh from the top of the Dune Ridge Trail. Perhaps no other place shows off the park's natural wonders like the Dune Ridge Trail.

122nd Annual Audubon Christmas Bird Count: Wednesday, December 29, 2021

Join tens of thousands of volunteers throughout the Americas for an adventure. Families, amateur birders, and scientists alike arm themselves with binoculars, bird guides, and checklists and go out on an annual mission to count the world's bird populations. At the end, hikers will be welcomed by park volunteers with snacks and a cozy campfire provided by the Friends of the Indiana Dunes. Snowshoeing the Dunes Weather permitting – need a 6-inch snow base

The Indiana Dunes State Park Nature Center will offer Snowshoe rentals every Wednesday thru Sunday, from mid-December to mid-March between 9:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. A driver's license is required for the rental and the cost is \$5 per pair for the entire day. Reservations cannot be made. Call the Nature Center at 219-926-1390 for questions on the snow conditions.



Snowshoeing and cross-country skiing can be enjoyed on most Indiana Dunes National Park Trails. If you don't have your own equipment, there are a limited number of snowshoes available for loan at no cost for use on the Miller Woods Trail at the Paul H. Douglas Center for Environmental Education. Call 219-395-1824 for snow conditions and snowshoe availability. In January and February on every Saturday (1:30-3:30 p.m. at Douglas Center) and most Sundays (1:00-3:00 p.m. at Visitor Center) join a ranger to try your feet on a guided snowshoe hike. **Snowshoes provided by Friends of Indiana Dunes**
