### Friends of Indiana Dunes Updates

Hard to believe that summer is already coming to an end but many of the leaves are changing color as our nights are cooling down. The Friends' produce stand is still going strong with the weekly filling of delectable vegetables from the Chellberg Farm. For a small donation to the Friends, visitors to the produce stand have been able to acquire heirloom tomatoes, cucumbers, peppers and squashes of several varieties. Speaking about Chellberg, the Friends have recently purchased new chickens to fill the farm's coop which is undergoing some upgrades. In order to help defray costs associated with keeping these chickens healthy and happy, the Friends will be unveiling an "Adopt a Chicken Program" at the upcoming Duneland Fall Festival.



Along with the new chickens, the Friends have purchased fifteen turkey poults to raise up at the Chellberg Farm. These turkeys will be all dressed up and ready for your Thanksgiving dinner table in early November. The Chellberg Farm Herefords are contentedly grazing away in the north pasture. They will be processed in late December and bundles of Chellberg Farm ground meat will be available for donation. Other fundraising efforts such as the Indiana Dunes National Park's BARK Ranger tags and the Maple Syrup are going well. The Friends will again be offering Field Courses, a fundraising program we did regularly in the 1980/90s. This November we will be offering a Natural Basket Weaving workshop (see details below) and Friends' members will be able to take the field courses at a reduced rate. We are asking you, our members, to suggest ideas for other Field Courses. Do you have a particular talent that you would like to share with others? Smokey was well photographed and was willing to share a moment with the State Park's Property Manager David Snodgrass and our Chair, Angel Goins. The Dunes Learning Center's Summer Camps were again highly successful and the Friends were able to help by offering our office location for their pre-camp curb-side Covid testing site.

### **Natural Basket Weaving Workshop**

November 5th from 9:00am to 4:00pm

Instructor Renell Roebuck learned how to weave baskets from her grandmother in Gladwin, Michigan where she grew up. Thirty years later she began teaching classes for the Wood County Park District. Since 2007, she has been teaching basket weaving classes as part of her role as a Naturalist for the Geauga Park District in Northeast Ohio. We are excited to host this special field course where participants will leave with a storage bin basket that has a 12" X 7" base and is 5.5" high with leather handles and color accents. Spaces are limited for this course and pre-registration is required by calling the Nature Center at 219-926-1390. Workshop fees for this creative field course are \$60 for Friends members and \$75 for non-members.




#### Plant Keeping and Propagation: November 8 with time to be determined (2-hour program)
