Spring - Challenging Yet Productive

Is it really Summer? Hard to believe it with all that has happened in the last three months. Winter brought little snow and mild temperatures, thus no shelf ice. Spring brought heavy northern winds and rainstorms. A deadly combination for the southern shores of Lake Michigan. The result - numerous beach areas in both parks experiencing considerable shoreline erosion.

The Covid-19 pandemic closed Indiana Dunes National and State Parks, halted environmental education camps at the Dunes Learning Center (DLC) and produced the most unusual Native Plant Sale in its 24-year history. However, through it all, your Friends Board has been fluid and has kept very busy.

This year, the Native Plant Sale was offered as orders only with no day of sale purchasing. Our loyal customers gladly adapted to the numerous changes and emails of "plants not available so please change your order", "the pick-up date being moved two weeks later to work within the State guidelines", and "schedule your plant pick-up time to keep the number of customers doing curb side to fewer than ten". We dealt with face masks, gloves, new pick-up location (thanks goodness we have the Friends new house/office) and not a single complaint. In fact, many of our customers donated their refund checks back to us and sent thank you's for a job well done. A huge cheer of appreciation to our members who volunteered to help with the Native Plant Sale. Our treasurer Zella Olson says our profit is comparable to last year – amazing!!!

The Friends Board has been working regularly in small groups at the house/office. The old carpeting was removed, the walls repaired and painted, toilet replaced, and the new water-resistant laminate floors are being installed this week. The National Park, the DLC and several Board members have donated office furniture and supplies. However, we are sad to report that the Friends house was broken into last week and the two computers donated to us from the DLC were stolen. The National Park's Visitor and Resource Protection rangers are investigating. Our secretary Kathy Wilder had just left and then returned shortly to find the front door standing open. The good news was no one was harmed and besides the theft only a window was broken.

Our newsletter editor Cliff Goins, has volunteered to take on our social media presence. With help from Geof Benson of the DLC, the Friends have updated our website (dunefriends.org) and revamped our Facebook page. Please take a few moments to look at all the improvements. During the order period for the plant sale, we posted a Plant of the Day and now have a Take a Hike Tuesday event on our Facebook page. Followers have increased by 25%. This is also a great way to share what our partners are doing as well as inform the public of all the wonderful things the Friends are sponsoring. Some of our most shared posts have been items we have purchased to help the National and State Parks' enhance the visitor experience. The State Park is now able to offer virtual programs on their Facebook page since the Friends purchased a GoPro action camera for their use.

The Friends partnered with the National Park's Resource Management staff to write and submit a NIPSCO Environmental Action Grant. The requested funds will be used to develop pollinators gardens at the Headquarters complex and the Douglas Center. The goals are to create local genotype seed beds as well increase the number of native pollinators in the Indiana dunes area. Volunteers from the Friends and NIPSCO will help the National Park plant and maintain these pollinator gardens. The Friends were pleased to hear that NIPSCO approved our grant request and \$5,000 was awarded to fund this vital project.

The Friends may have experienced a few challenges these past few months but continue to look to the future and know that with your help we will continue to supply both financial and volunteer support to our fabulous partners – the Indiana Dunes National Park, the Indiana Dunes State Park and the Dunes Learning Center.

Summer Programs Information

Currently, there is no information on specific programs. Our partners continue to operate within the State of Indiana's "Getting Back on Track" and the CDC guidelines. > Indiana Dunes National Park will not offer any traditional ranger-led programs or special events this summer due to the difficulty of social distancing during them. Instead, we plan to set up interpretive stations throughout the national park at parking lots and other areas, where rangers, can interact with smaller groups of people and still maintain social distancing. There will be a tent and table, or other barrier, to create space between the staff and visitors. We will continue to offer virtual ranger-led programs on our social media. The campground is currently closed and any plans to open it are still uncertain. In addition, the Dorothy Buell

If you plan to visit either the National or the State Park this summer, remember that restrooms are limited. Bring your own drinking water and hand sanitizer. Please carry out your own trash. If you picnic, bring and use a covering for your picnic table and take it with you when you leave.
