Fall Programs Information

Currently programming information is ever changing as our partners continue to operate within the State of Indiana's "Getting Back on Track" and the CDC guidelines. Indiana Dunes National Park: Unfortunately, all public programs remain cancelled until further notice, including the popular Century of Progress House Tours, the Indiana Dunes Apple Festival and the Outdoor Adventure Festival. Most outside areas and park facilities are open except for Central Ave. and Lakeview beaches being closed due to erosion damage. The inside information desk at the visitor center is still closed with the rangers staffing an information tent outside the center. The bathrooms and the Eastern National Bookstore are open inside but require anyone entering to wear a mask. The Douglas Center is open and is also requiring visitors and staff to wear a mask inside.

We continue to look forward to the day when we can resume our normal operations and again offer ranger-led programs and special events to the public. Indiana Dunes NP (nps.gov/indu) for more information.

Annual Meeting and Report

Normally in September, the Friends Board of Directors would invite our fellow members to join them for our Annual Meeting at a local pizza place. However with the ongoing concerns to control the pandemic, this year's Annual Meeting will be cancelled and replaced by the following report.

The Friends continue to provide both financial and volunteer support to the Indiana Dunes National Park (NP) and Indiana Dunes State Park (SP) as well as the Dunes Learning Center (DLC). In 2019, the Friends entered into a Philanthropic Partnership Agreement with the NP which involved the Friends rehabbing a house located on the northwest corner of Oak Hill and Mineral Springs roads to be used as office space for the Friends for the next 30 years. The exterior and interior of the house have been painted and the old carpeting removed and replaced with vinyl flooring. Office furniture and computers were donated by the parks, DLC and Board members. Tables and chairs were purchased. The house is now ready for use as an office. In fact, several Board members wearing masks socially distanced ourselves while virtually talking with the NP, SP and DLC representatives for the July Friends' Board meeting.

In 2019, the Friends continued to support the many popular special events at the National Park such as Maple Sugar Time, Green Gary, Midsummer, West Beach Concert, Apples Festival, Outdoor Adventure Festival and Holiday Traditions as well as purchased the Bark Ranger tags, covered printing costs for the Junior Ranger booklets and covered the cost of catering the Volunteer Appreciation Hog Roast. Of special note, the Friends purchased the Art Panels for the NP Exhibit Room in the Porter County Tourism/NP Visitor Center.

The Friends continued to support the many Interpretive events at the State Park such as the First Day Hike, Full Moon Hikes, S'mores event, Hummingbird Banding programs, Sand Sculpture Contest, Ouiatenon Brigade, Storytelling Festival, and the Christmas Eve Morning Stroll. We also covered costs associated with the Nature Center Summer Camps, bird seed, library subscriptions, and the Volunteer Appreciation Dinner. Of special note, in 2019 the Friends purchased the supplies needed to complete the outdoor enclosure for the box turtle and for the Nature Center's new water bottle filling station. The Friends have designed and purchased metal water bottles with our logo and web address to be sold at the SP Nature Center.

The Dunes Learning Center continues to provide superior environmental education programming through their Frog in the Bog program and the Friends are pleased to continue to provide financial support for this residential program for area fourth graders. Of special note in 2019, the Friends were able to increase the overall amount of your financial support for the DLC and helped cover the costs associated with outreach programming such as the Citizen Science program.

The Friends hosted another very successful Native Plant Sale on May 1, 2020. Due to the Covid pandemic, the sale was postponed from its original date, changed to a pre-order only event with scheduled pick-up times and still was able to generate more profit than our 2019 Native Plant Sale. Please mark your calendars as the date for our 25th Annual Native Plant Sale has been set for April 24, 2021.

In late 2019, the Friends received a donation of \$5,000 from the Carmuese employees to be used to overhaul the bird viewing area at the SP as well as add a more active water feature to improve the overall wildlife habitat of this area. The estimate to complete this project is \$7,000 so the Friends will fund the difference. In early 2020, the Friends received a NIPSCO grant in amount of \$5,000 to develop a native pollinator garden just north of the NP Headquarters area. The Board wants to acknowledge the generous \$800 memorial received in July 2020 from the family of Vincent Dillman. His sister spoke of how their family would spend countless hours visiting and playing in the Indiana Dunes in their youth and continuing into their adult years. These funds will be used to help support family friendly events at the NP and SP.

Please accept our gratitude and thanks for your continued support of the Friends of Indiana Dunes. Your membership dollars mean even more this year as they allow the Friends to continue to provide the much-needed financial support to our partners. We all look forward to resuming being able to visit and play in a Covid free Indiana Dunes. Please be safe and stay healthy.
