State Park Bird Observation Tower Dedication



It was a beautiful windy day for the dedication of the new Bird Observation Tower. On October 4, over 100 people gathered to celebrate the official occasion from partnering agencies, INDNR dignitaries, area school children, and State Park employees. This architectural tower masterpiece is located next to Trail 3 up from the West Beach parking lot. The celebration included a ceremony led by Indiana DNR State Parks Director, Daniel Bortner, with the help of Discovery Charter School and Liberty Elementary School Hobart students. Humane Indiana Wildlife brought their live educational red-tail hawk, refreshments were served by the Indiana Audubon and the Friends of the Indiana Dunes. Park volunteers helped pass out programs and lead participants in making a bird tower memory bookmark. Thank you to the Friends of Indiana Dunes for providing a luncheon for the dignitaries at this ceremony.

Maple Sugar Time - March 2, 3, 9 and 10, 2019



Enjoy an early taste of spring at the National Lakeshore's annual Maple Sugar Time festival. In addition to the free, ranger-led tours of the sugaring operation at the historic Chellberg Farm, a pancake breakfast will be available for purchase. The farm will be bustling with maple sugaring activities from 10am–4pm. One-hour tours start every 20 minutes each day. Join one to learn how American Indians first boiled maple sap into sugar and how early settlers used large iron kettles to make syrup. Stand in the warm steam of the sugar shack where sap is still boiled down the way the Chellberg family did it back in the 1930s. Try your hand at drilling a tap hole, lugging heavy sap buckets using an old-fashioned yoke, or just enjoying a free taste of pure maple syrup! Warm up in the farm house and collect recipes featuring maple syrup. Pure maple syrup and related products will be for sale on site.

Meet at the Paul H. Douglas Center for a ranger-led hike through Miller Woods to the shore of Lake Michigan. This amazing hike goes through a globally rare black oak savannah and around towering sand dunes and interdunal wetlands.



Nature Center's Snowshoe Rentals: Wednesdays through Sundays this winter, 9:30 to 4:30pm


Running with the Irish 5K Race: March 16
