The Friends of Indiana Dunes are happy to again partner with the Indiana Dunes National Park and the Dunes Learning Center to present this two-day festival at Chellberg Farm from 11am-4pm that celebrates everything apple. There will be entertainment provided by several local musicians and the Northwest Indiana Storytellers. Volunteers will be needed to demonstrate pressing apples for cider; cooking to make apple butter, sauce, donuts, and cookies; discuss the many uses of apple cider vinegar; peeling apples with an old fashion crank peeler; and getting visitors off and on the wagon ride. ### Third Friday of Each Month - Music Heritage Series

Come out for a night of music and song. The Save the Tunes Council is a group of local musicians devoted to preserving and passing on folk songs using a variety of traditional musical instruments. This season the program is offered from 7:30 pm – 9:00 pm on September 20, October 18, and November 15 at the Indiana Dunes Visitor Center.

### Every Sunday Sept 1 to Dec 15 – Miller Woods Hike

Meet at the Douglas Center at 1:30pm for a ranger-led hike through Miller Woods to the shore of Lake Michigan. This hike goes through a globally rare black oak savannah and around towering sand dunes and interdunal wetlands.

### Every Sunday in September and October – Feeding at the Farm

From 4:30 to 5pm, help feed the farm animals at the Chellberg Farm.

### First and Third Saturdays in Sept, Oct & Nov - Playdate in the Nature Play Zone

Kids of all ages are invited to spend a couple of hours having fun in nature. Join a ranger from 1-3pm and explore Miller Woods, build a fort, climb a tree, create awesome nature art, and so much more.



### Bus Tour of Indiana Dunes – Sunday Oct 6 & 27 and Nov 10

Join a ranger for a two-hour tour of Indiana Dunes National Park in one of the park's 15-passenger shuttle buses. The tour is free. Reservations are required. Space is limited. Tours leave at 1 pm. Call 219-395-1882 to make reservations and get more information.

### Saturdays Sept 28, Oct 26 and Nov 23 – Science in the Park

Meet scientists and local experts that are conduction research in the National Park. Following a short presentation at the visitor center at 2pm, go out into the field to see their work during this two-hour program.

# Saturdays Sept 28, Oct 26 and Nov 23 – Migration Birding with the Indiana Audubon Society

Join birding expert and Indiana Audubon Society Executive Director Brad Bumgardner for his monthly birding series. Meet at 9am at the Visitor Center and carpool to the birding spot of the month. Bring binoculars and dress for the weather.

### Saturday, October26 – Halloween Hoopla

In the spirit of Halloween, learn about spiders and other creepy crawlies of the animal world with Jim Louderman, entomologist at the Field Museum from 1:00 pm to 4:00 pm in the Douglas Center. At 2:00 pm, Kim Hoover of "Hoots to Howls" rehabilitation center, will be bringing some live owls currently under their care. Follow up your day with a short night hike on the Douglas trail outside the center from 4:00 pm to 5:30 pm. We hope to get you comfortable exploring nature at night without the use of light.

### Saturday, November 2 – Gales of November Shipwreck Program

From1-3pm at the Visitor Center, learn about the treacherous side of the Great Lakes in this fascinating program about the storms and shipwrecks of the past.

### Friday, November 29 – Black Friday Opt Outside Hike

Join a ranger for a post-Thanksgiving hike instead of shopping on black Friday. Co-sponsored by Save the Dunes, the interactive hike will be led by regional experts in fields such as birding, botany, insects, geology, and ecology. Meet at 1pm at West Beach.

### Saturday, November 30 – Turkey Trot

Join a ranger in search of wild turkey and other wildlife as you work off Thanksgiving dinner. Hike along the ancient Calumet shoreline of Lake Michigan through forested dunes and small blowouts. Meet at 1pm at the Calumet Dunes parking lot.

### Singing Sands Stargaze - September 7, 8-11 p.m.

Bring a blanket and join us on the main beach near the pavilion for an annual event with local astronomers from the Calumet Astronomical Society. Special telescopes will be set up as well as periodic constellation talks.

### Full Moon Hike - September 14, 7:30 p.m.

Join Naturalists and volunteers for this special hike to Lake Michigan and back. You can meet at the Nature Center one hour before the hike for a presentation about our moon along with some "stellar" treats. Hike begins at 8:00 p.m.

#### Saw-whet Owl Banding Demonstrations - October & November

The Indiana Dunes State Park is partnering with the Indiana Audubon Society in its annual fall owl banding research and education station from October 17 to November 178. Visitors to the state park may come to the park's nature center after sunset on Thursday through Sunday during the season to learn about the special program. Guests will have an opportunity to see a live owl up-close during the banding process. Evening presentations are free, after the paying the standard entrance gate fees, and begin at 7:00 pm in October, then 6:00 pm after November 2. Conditions are weather dependent and current banding schedules are best found out by calling the Nature Center.


